PREFACE

The 1858 Map of Calhoun County is the first detailed published map of Calhoun County generally available to genealogists and historians, although other earlier original official handwritten plat maps and less detailed county maps are known to exist.

Although dated 1858, this map of Calhoun County actually was prepared with information obtained in late 1857. We reproduce here two articles about the map which appeared in the *Albion Mirror* September 10 and September 24, 1857, pgs. 2:

MAP of CALHOUN COUNTY.—Messrs GEIL, HARLEY & SIVER, are progressing rapidly with their map, and will have it ready for delivery in the month of November.

This Map will exhibit all the Public Roads, Rail Roads, the location of Churches, School Houses, Hotels, Mills, Manufaciories, Dwellings, &c., Section, Quar-
er and Farm Lines, Lakes, Ponds, Streams and other objects of importance throught the County. The names of Property Owners generally will be inserted in their proper places. Plans of the principle villages, on an enlarged scale, with a busines directory of each, containing the names and business of Subscribers, and a DISTANCE TABLE, showing the distance between any two villages in the County will be engraved on the margin. The Map will be handsomely colored, mounted on rollers and finished in the best style. It will thus be a highly ornamental, interesting and very valuable work.

One of the Publishers of the new County Map is now in our village, and will call upon our citizens for the purpose of getting the location of property, making corrections, noting improvements, &c. We trust he will be well received, and that the well known enterprise of the citizens of Albion will not be compromised in this matter. All who have examined the specimen copy and plan of this map, are unanimous in the opinion that it will be a very desirable work, and one that the citizens of this county have long stood in need of. Could we not have our village represented upon the map, by some views of prominent buildings? Other villages will be so represented, and we have some private dwellings, public buildings, mills, and business

blocks, that would appear to as much advantage as any in the county. Persons wishing to consult with the publisher, can do so by calling at the Knapp House.

The original scroll-type map measures a huge 4 feet 8 inches wide, and 4 feet 10 inches tall, plus the wooden scroll rod at the bottom. Due to its size, this makes the original copy difficult for copying by genealogists and historians, although numerous original copies still exist throughout the county. The use of several different colors on the map also made it difficult for photocopying in the normal fashion.

We have carefully reproduced the entire 1858 map, township by township, city by city, etc. onto 8½ x 11 size paper format. All reproductions are their actual size as printed on the original. In some cases we have had to cut city maps in half and continued the remainder portion on another page in order to maintain the page standard size, but everything is there.

We have also included reproductions of the various lithographic views of buildings and homes, which appear on the perimeter of the 1858 map.

The Local History Archives of the Albion Historical Society serves as a repository for historical documents and items from the Albion area. We welcome inquiries, and are happy to correspond with descendants of Albion area citizens concerning their ancestors.

We maintain family surname files, and collect family histories, genealogies, photographs, diaries, old Albion newspapers, and other materials related to Albion and its people. If you would like more information, feel free to write us.

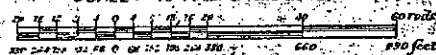

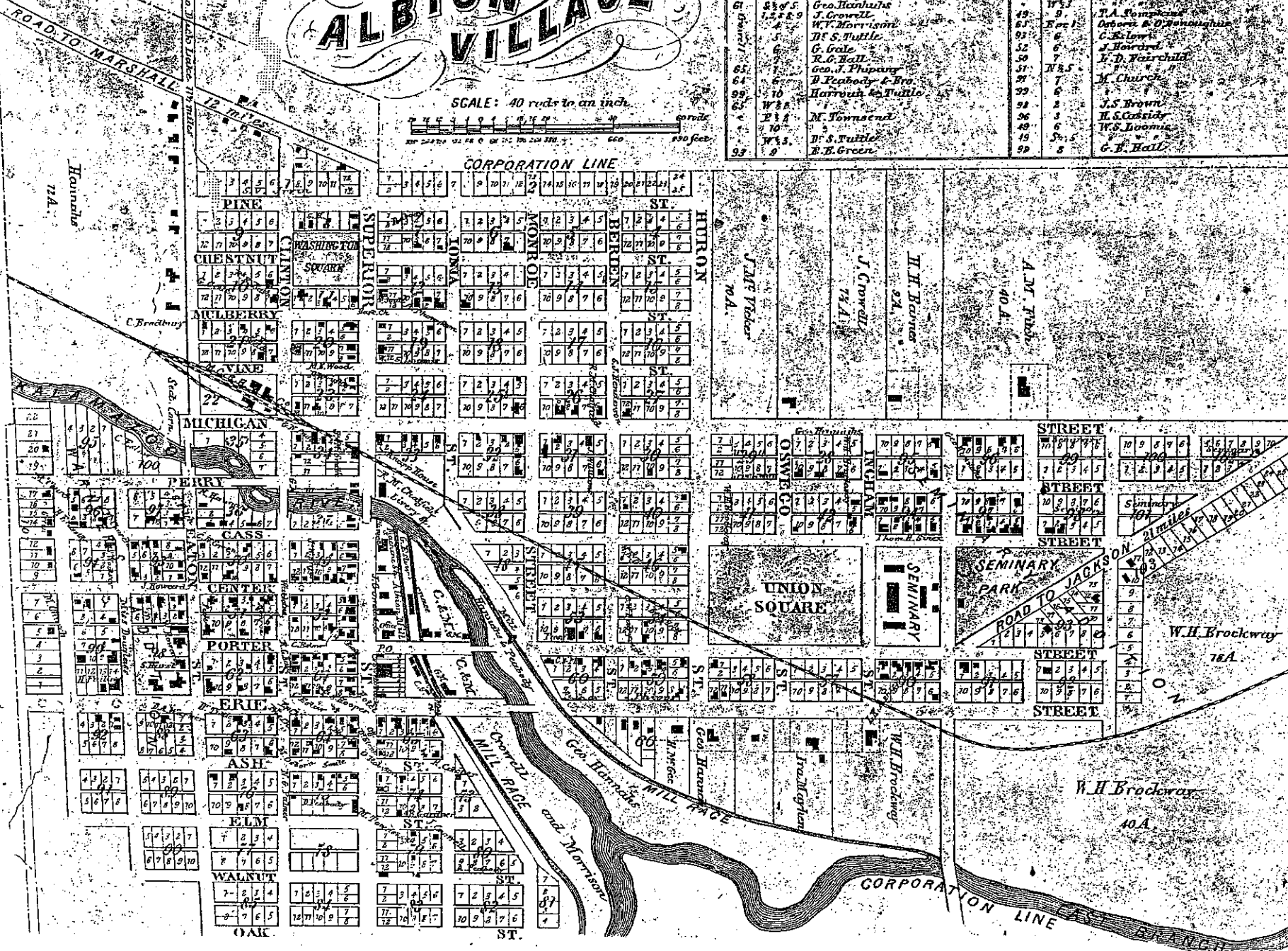

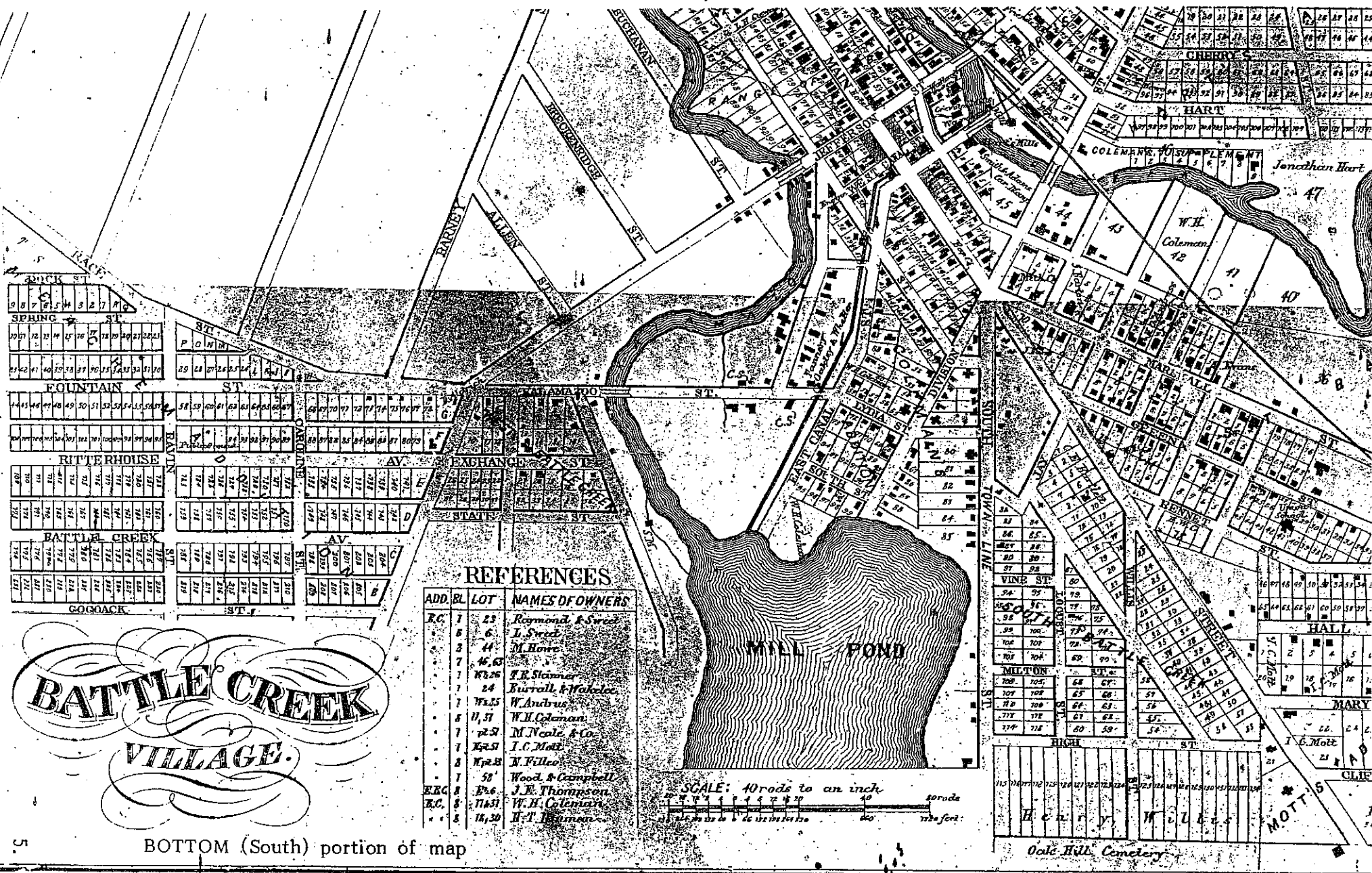

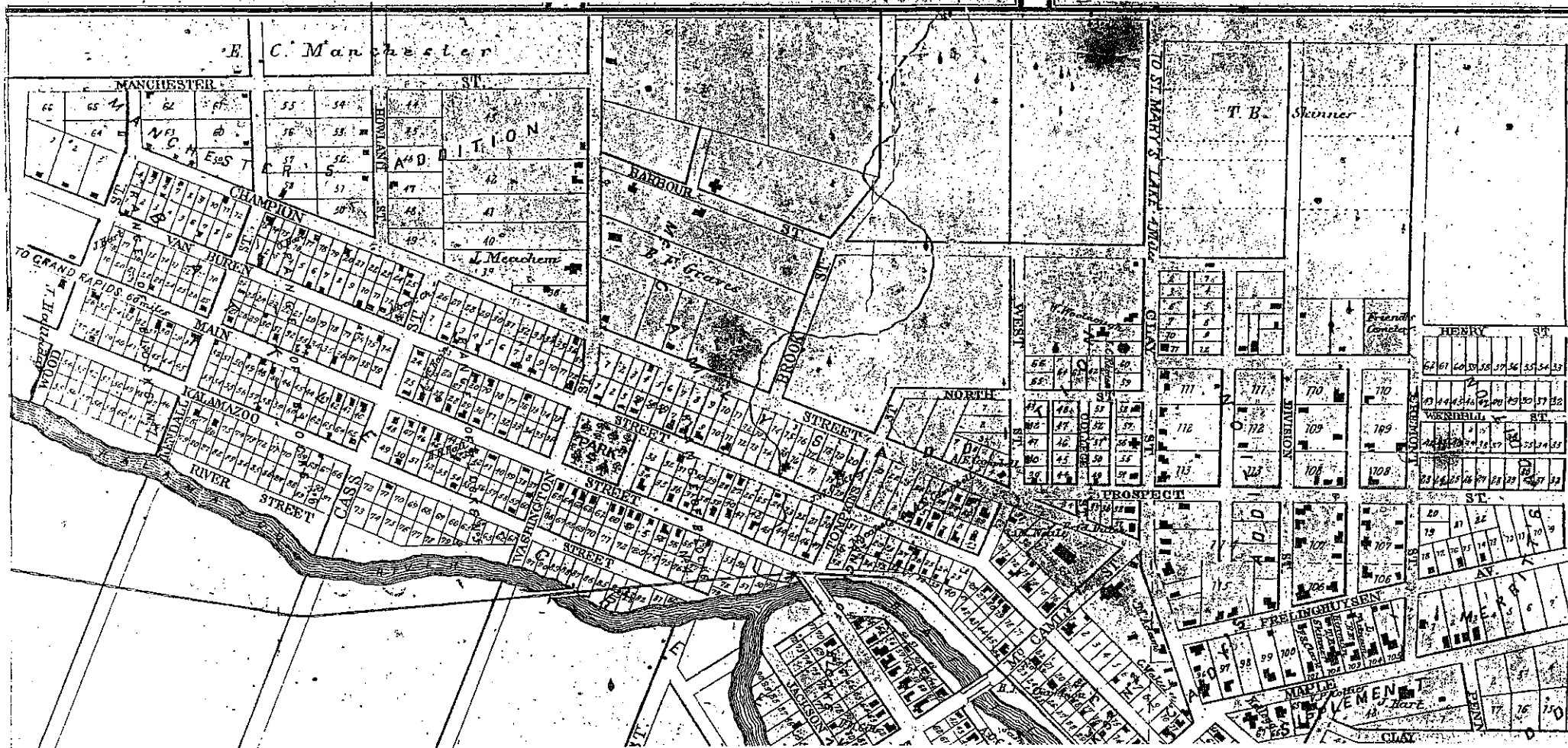

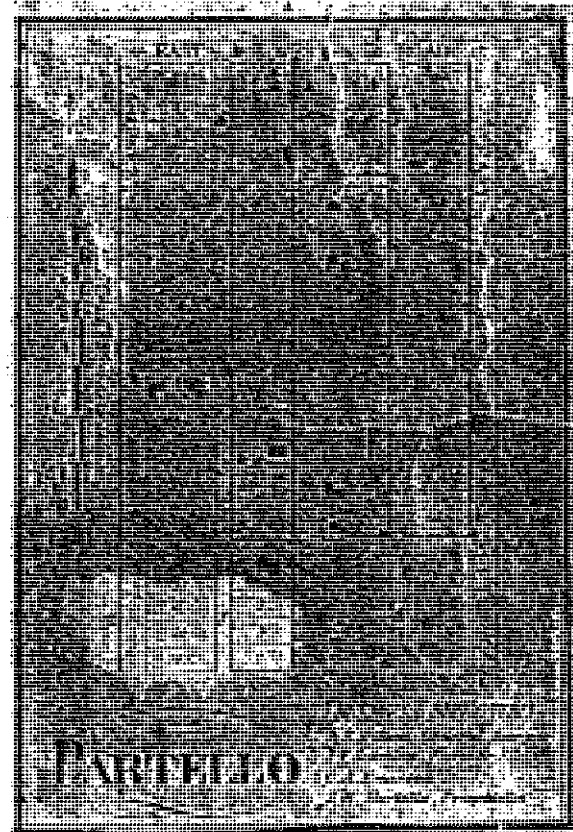

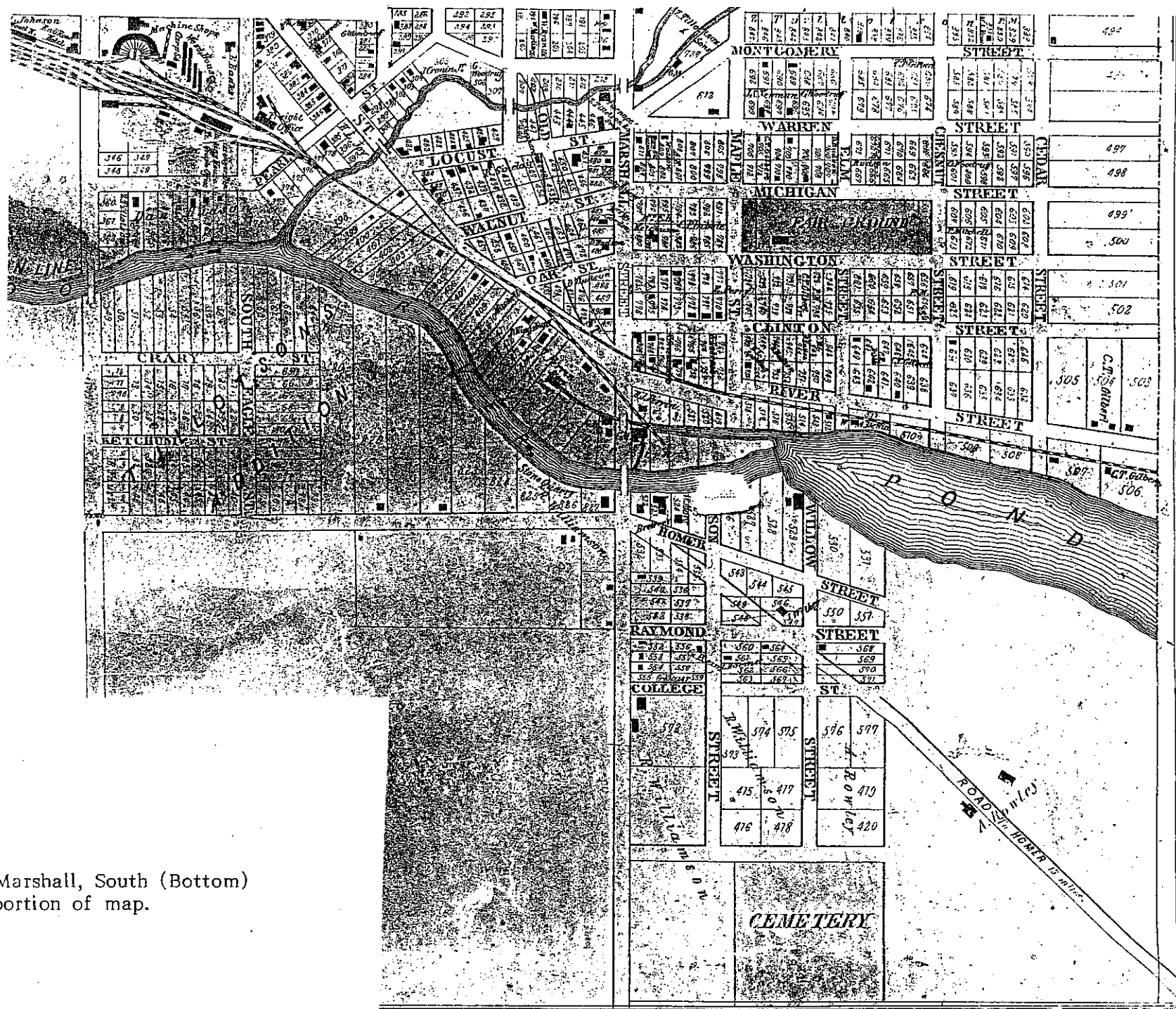

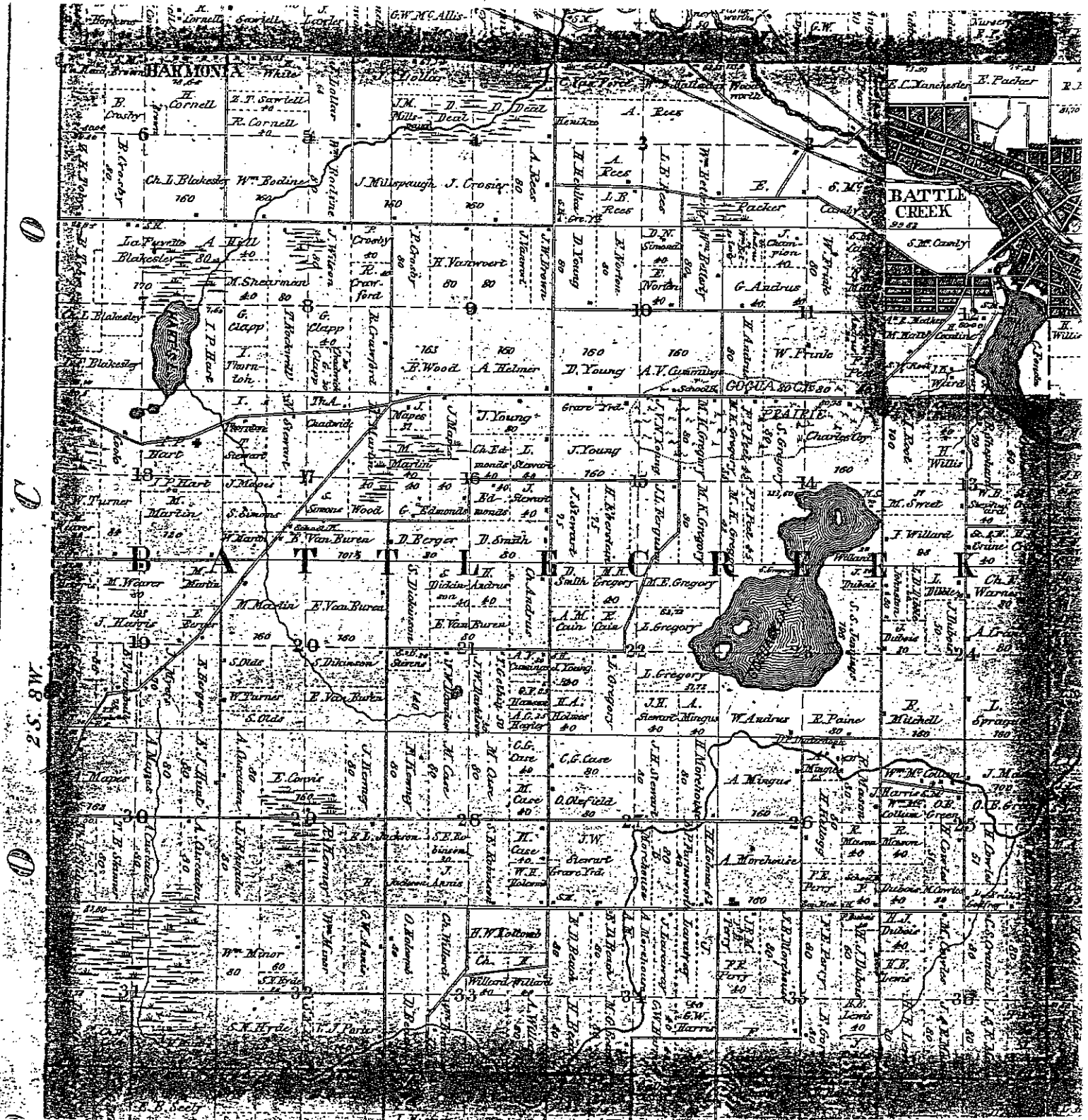

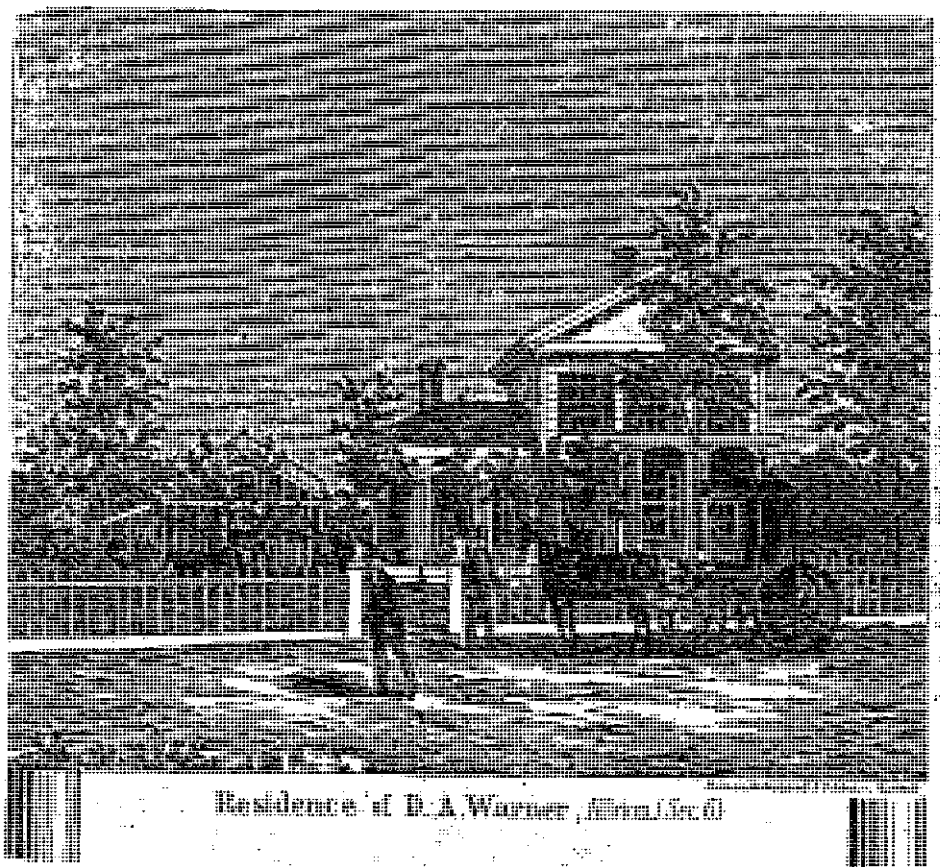


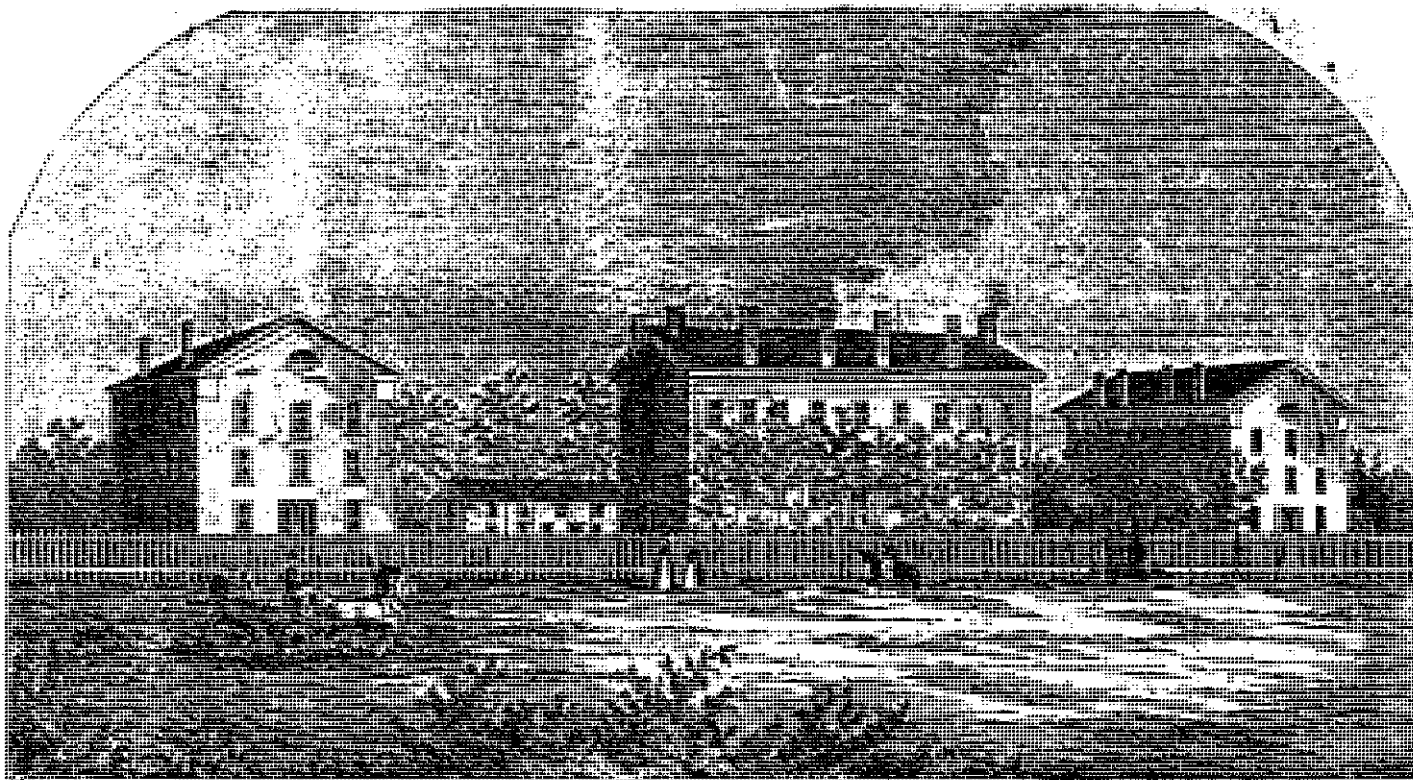
This was the home of William A. Warner (1816-1884), a prominent farmer who owned 300 acres of land on the north side of B Drive South, just east of 24 Mile Road.

The house depicted here is now gone.

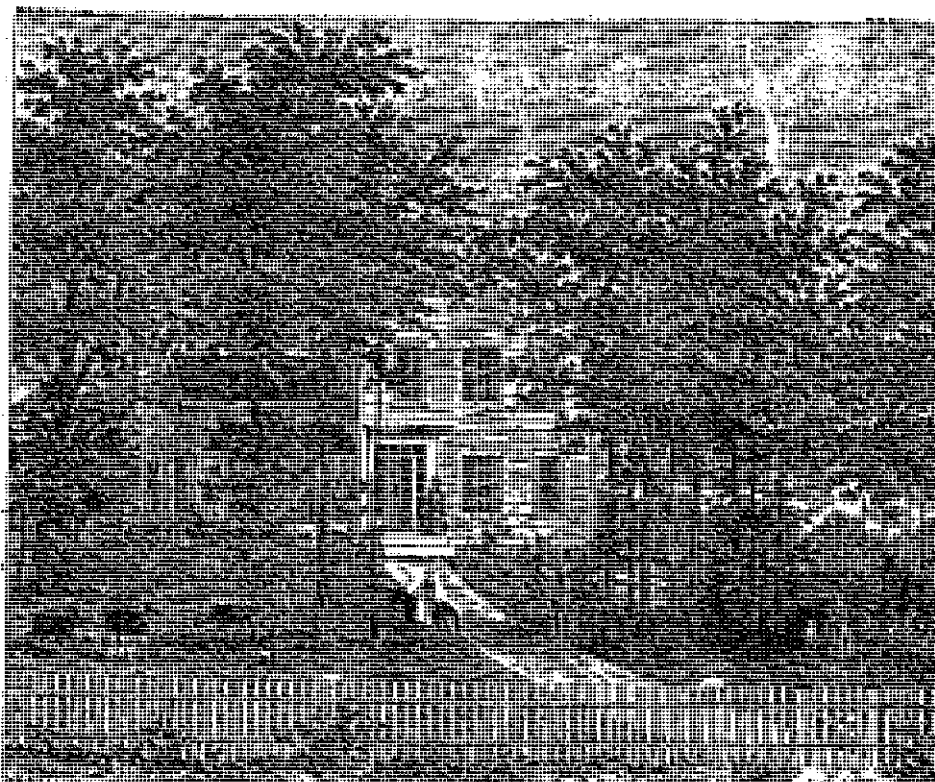
This is the home of Darius Warner (1823-1896), a brother of the above mentioned William A. Warner. Darius' farm was located just north of his brother William's farm.

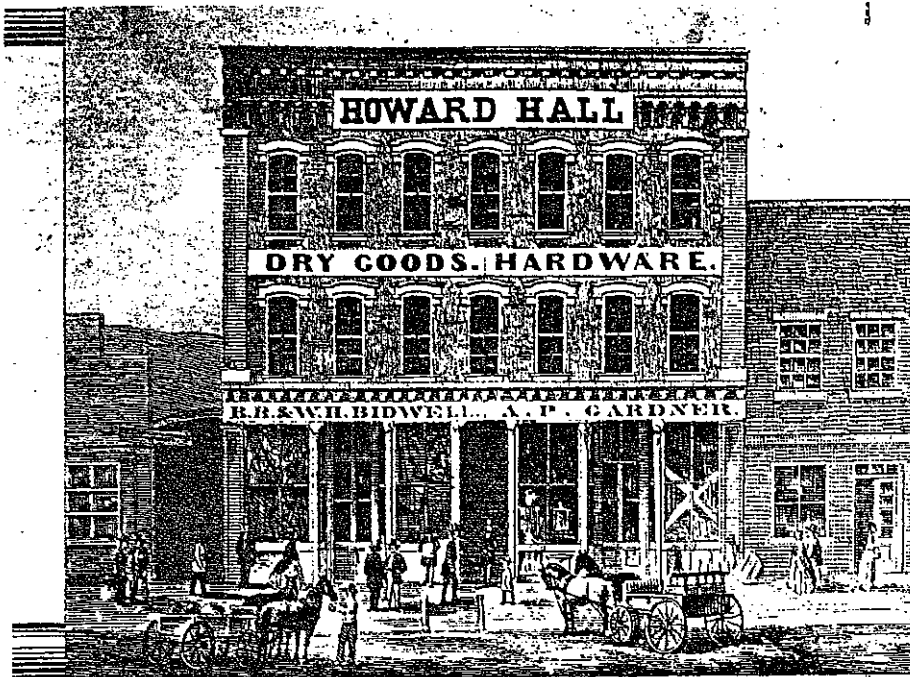
The above lithograph of Albion College shows the Central Building (center), with the north and south hall buildings. The small "ball house" is in the rear of the Central building .

This is the home of the Hon. Ira Mayhew (1814-1894), a local banker who served as Michigan's State Superintendent of Public Instruction during the 1840s, and as principal of the Wesleyan Seminary (Albion College) in 1853. He again served as State School Superintendent from 1854 to 1859. Mayhew operated Mayhew's Commercial College from 1860 to 1869 in Albion, at which time he moved the school to Detroit. The school eventually became the Detroit Business University.

The home picture here was newly built in 1857, and stands today at 604 E. Erie St. in the city of Albion.



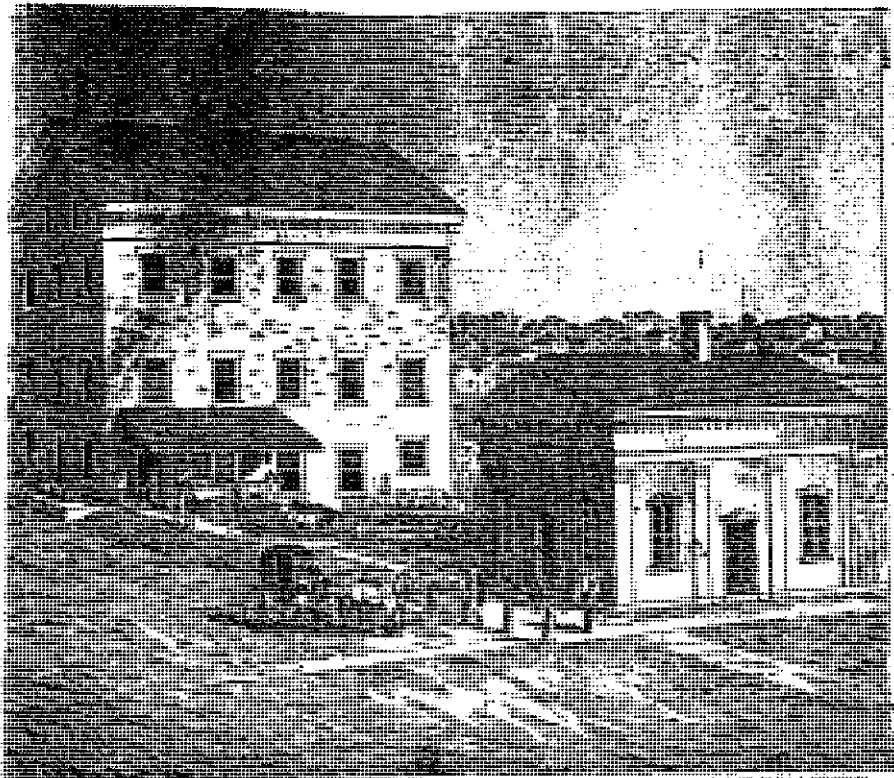
Howard Hall, Albion.

Howard Hall was erected in 1857 by local harness maker John Howard (1843-1893). This multi-purpose hall was located on the third floor of the structure, and served as a meeting and entertainment place for many years. The first floor contained businesses, while the second floor contained apartments. The building is still standing today in downtown Albion.



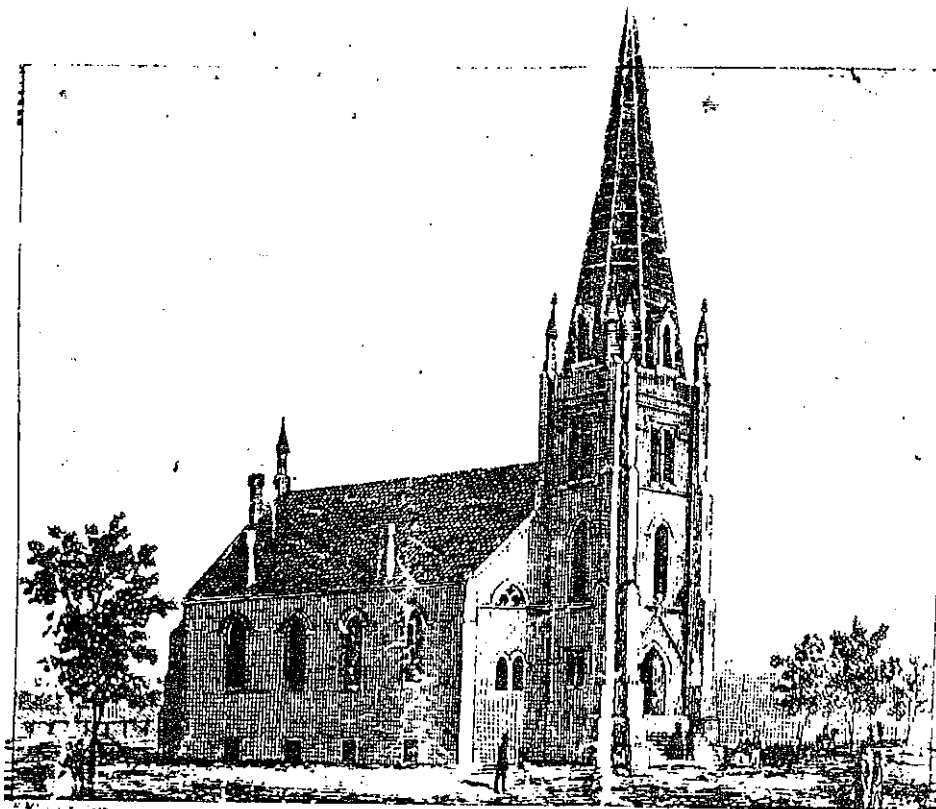
Crowell Block, Albion.

The Crowell Block in downtown Albion was named for "Albion's Greatest Benefactor" Jesse Crowell (1797-1872). The structure was erected in 1857 to replace a similar one that had collapsed at the site in April of that same year. The Crowell Block was the first brick commercial structure erected on the east side of Superior Street, and is still standing today.

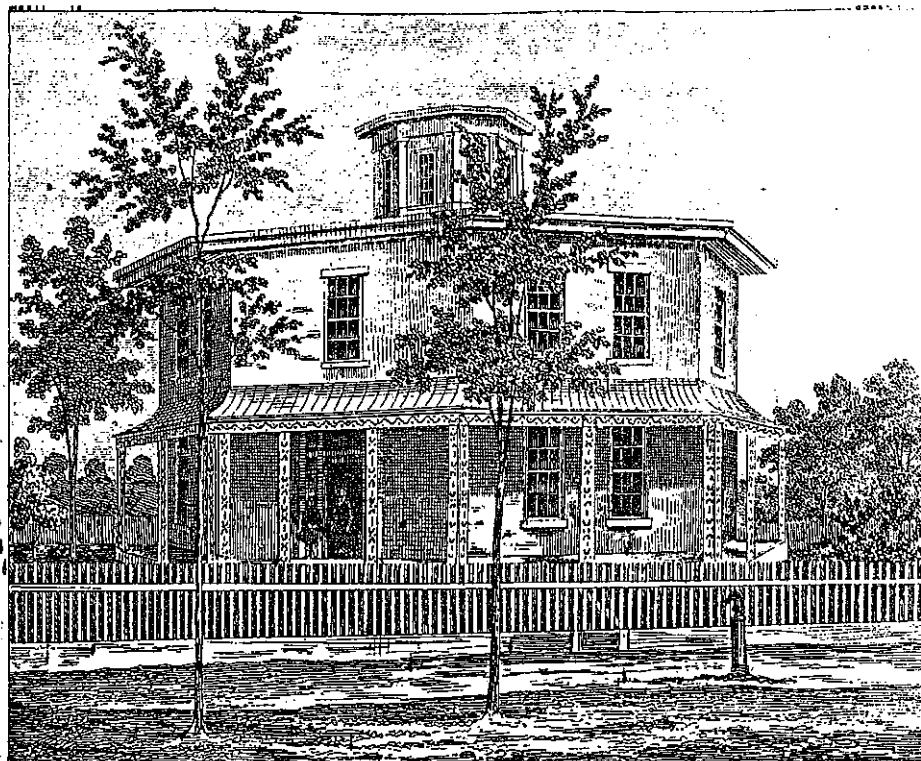


Albion Stone Mills and Office

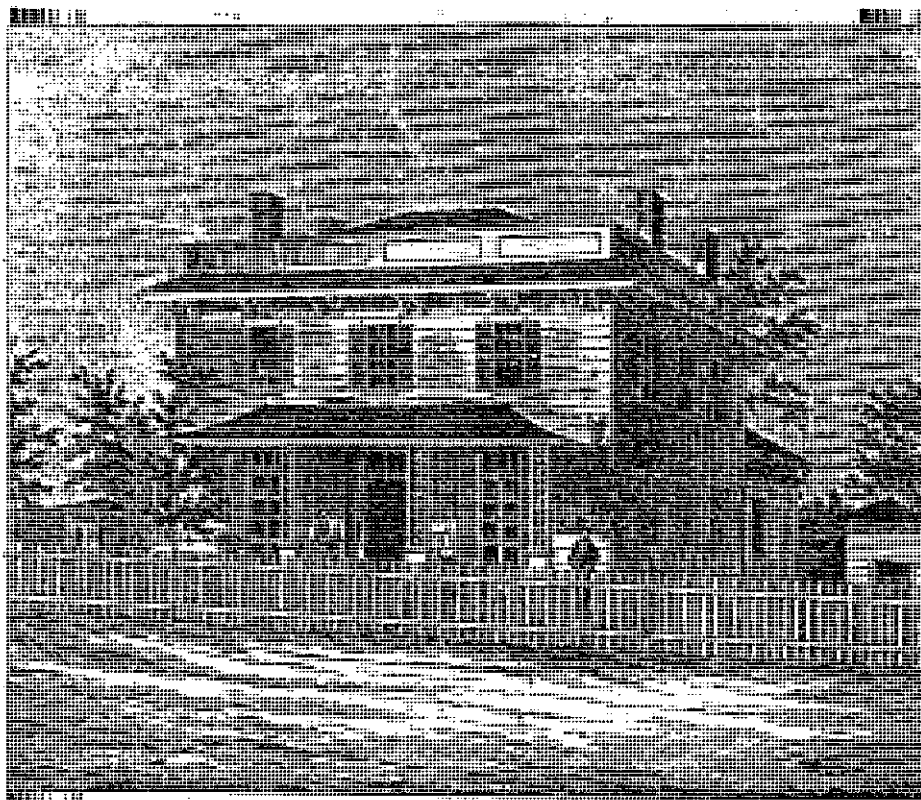


First Presbyterian Church, Albion.



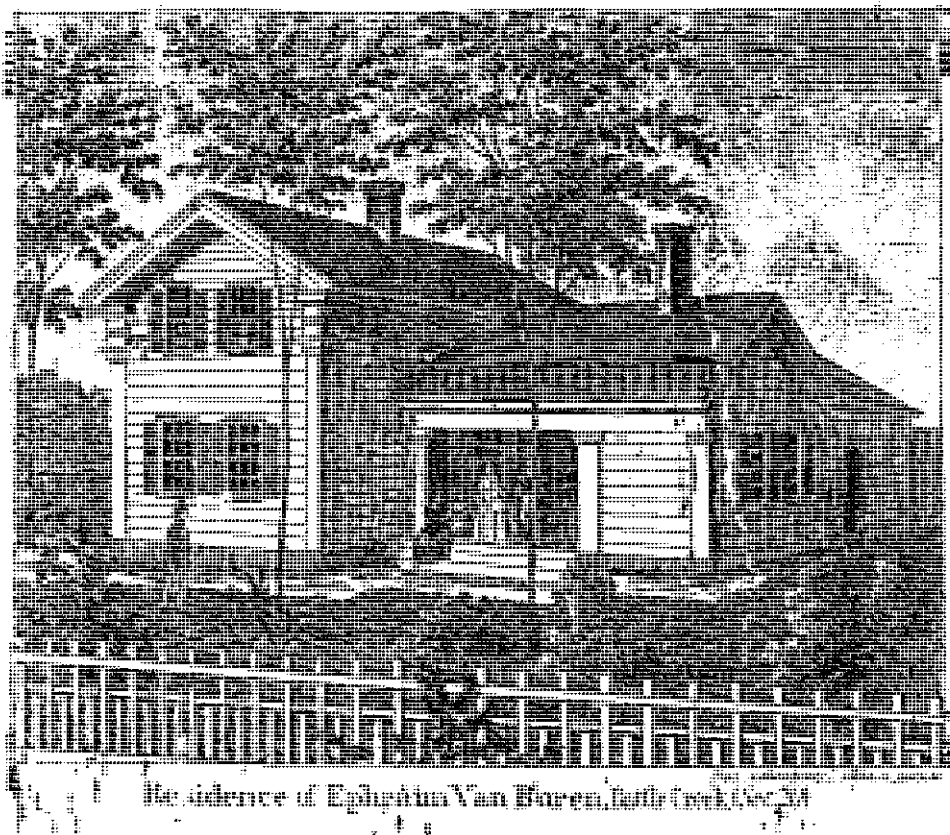

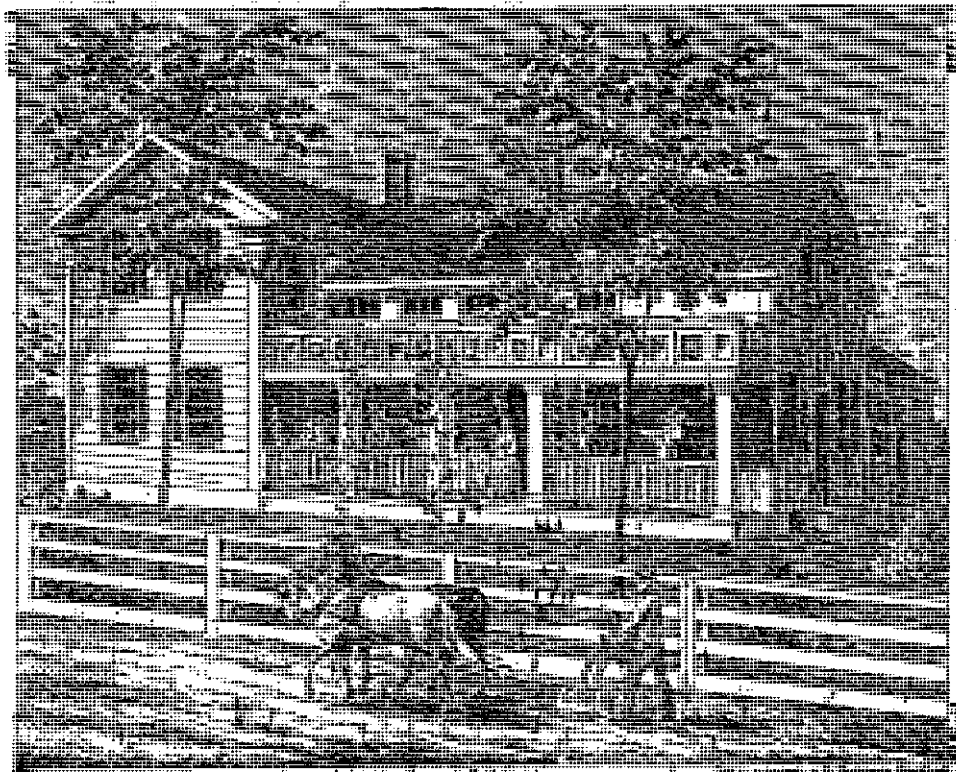
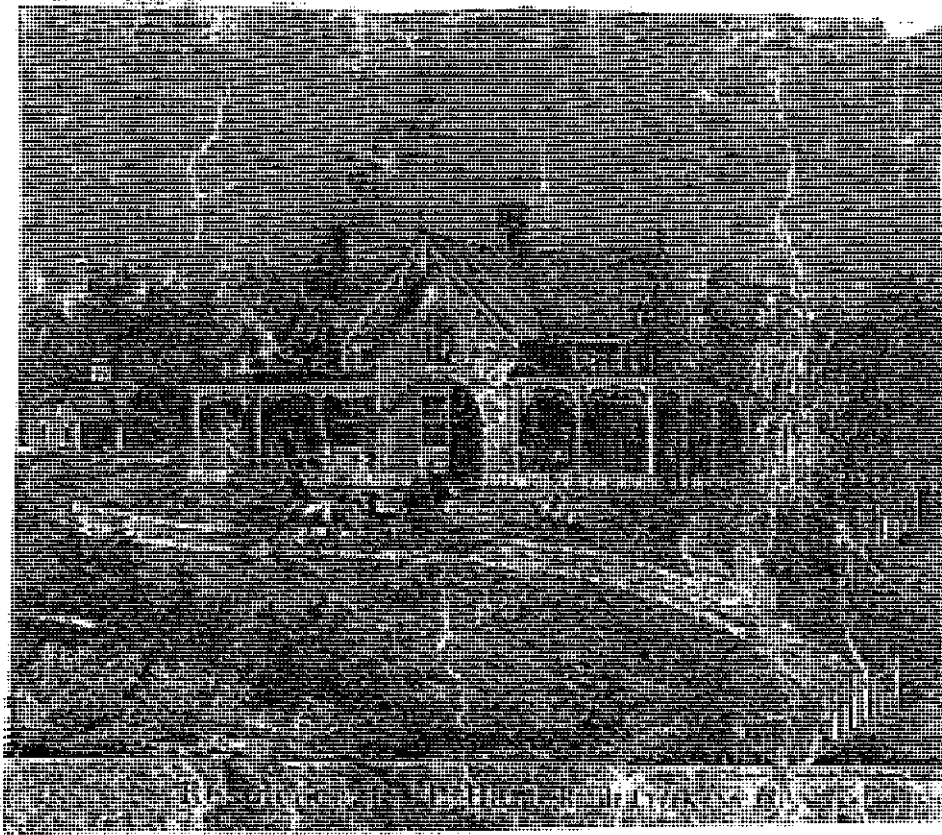


Residence of Ephraim Van Haren, Dutch Creek, Sec. 24

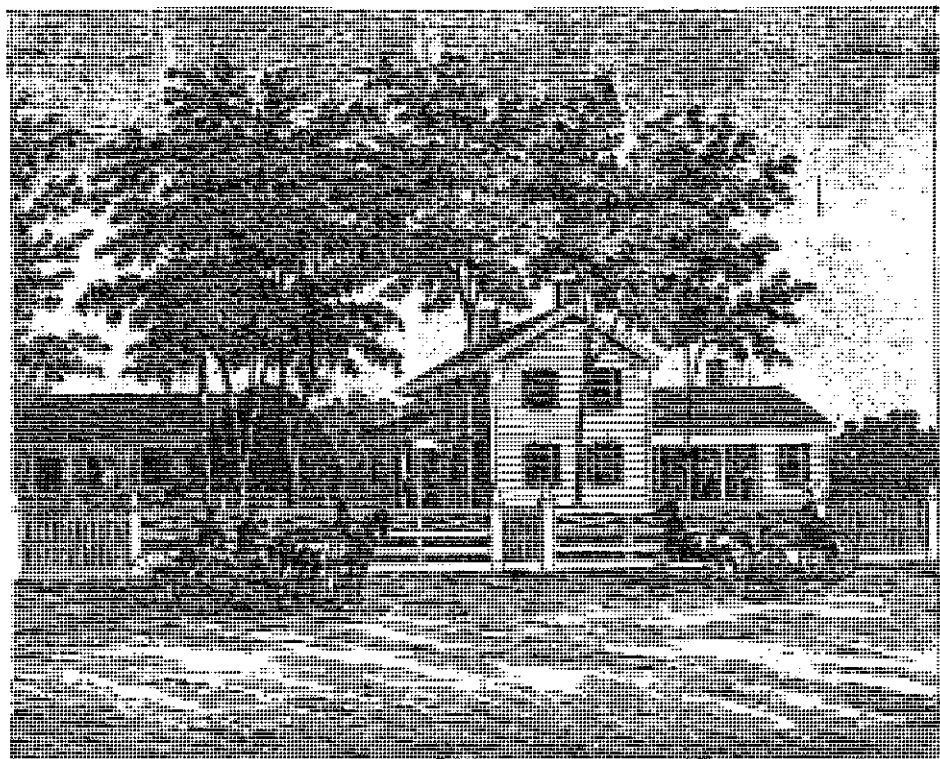


Residence of Aaron Marshouse, Dutch Creek, Sec. 26

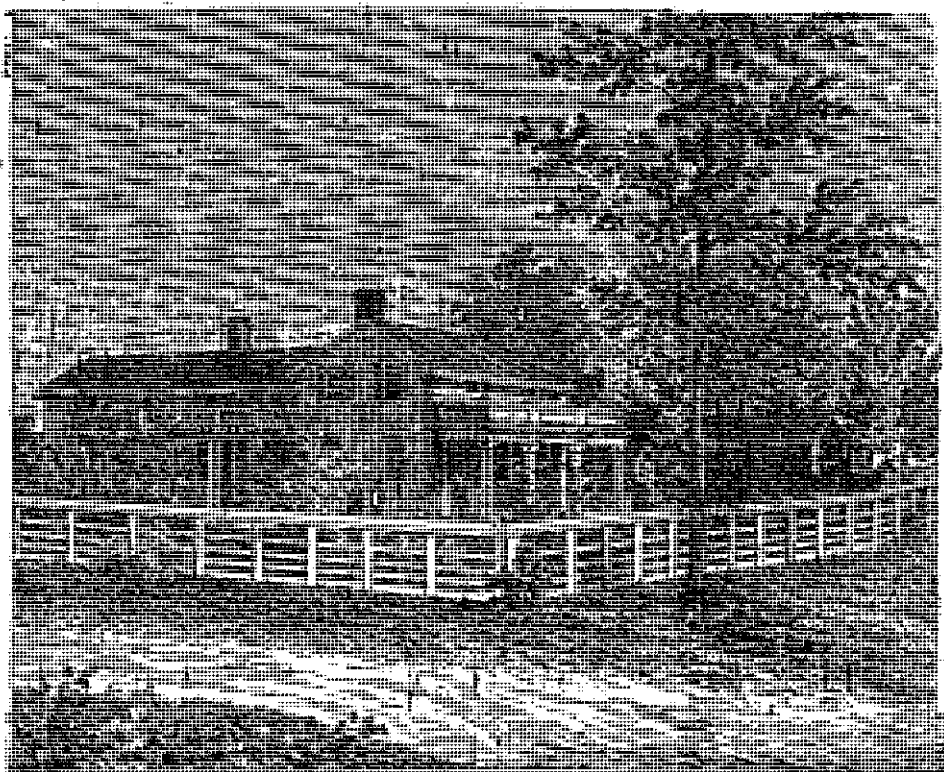
